



PH renewables get boosts from new 64-MW Cavite solar plant

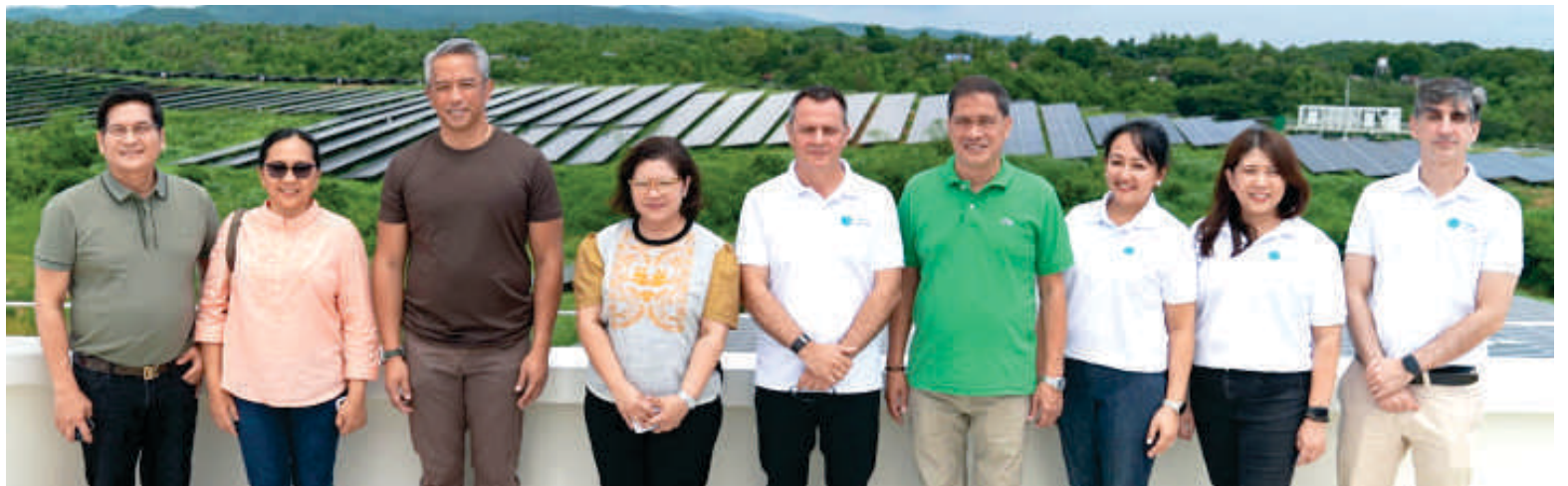
MANILA – The country's supply of renewable energy (RE) continues to increase as Prime Infra's unit, Prime Solar Solutions Corp., inaugurated its 64-megawatt solar power plant in Maragondon, Cavite on Wednesday.

The new solar plant is part of Prime Solar's 128-MW pilot project, which includes another facility in Tanauan, Batangas. Both were constructed in April last year.

"The plant inaugurated today is certainly a part of Prime Infra's wider sustainable strategy and continue to be very much aligned to our purpose of building better lives and resilient economies through critical infrastructure," Prime Infra president and chief executive officer Guillaume Lucci said.

Lucci said the Maragondon solar power plant has the capacity to power approximately 84,000 households and has the potential to displace over 100,000 tons of coal annually, significantly contributing to environmental conservation efforts.

Prime Solar has also

Meralco's power restoration efforts ongoing

MANILA – The Manila Electric Company (Meralco) on Thursday said it is targeting to cut in half the number of customers experiencing power interruptions amid the impacts of Super Typhoon Carina and the southwest monsoon.

In a press briefing, Meralco vice president and head of corporate communications Joe Zaldarriaga said as of 10 a.m. Thursday, 330,246 customers within its franchise areas are still experiencing power interruptions.

The night before, affected Meralco customers were twice as many, with 640,000 as of 6 p.m. Wednesday.

In Barangay Pantoc in Meycauayan City, Bulacan, some of the households had

no power service for eight hours.

Zaldarriaga said the heavy flooding in Metro Manila was the main reason for the power interruptions. Fallen trees and foreign objects obstructing power lines also affected the power services in several areas.

"We ask for your patience and understanding amid power disruptions caused by heavy floods caused by Super Typhoon Carina and the intensified southwest monsoon. The safety of our customers and Meralco line crews is our top priority as we continue to actively monitor the situation," he added.

Most of the customers experiencing power disruption are in the National

DTI imposes price freeze in NCR, other areas under state of calamity

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) imposes a price freeze on basic necessities in areas affected by the recent effects of Typhoon Carina and the southwest monsoon.

In an advisory, the price freeze is imposed in Metro Manila, Batangas, in Cainta, Rizal, Cavite, Pinamalayan in Oriental Mindoro, Bataan, and Bulacan.

According to DTI, based on Section 6 of the Republic Act 7581 or the Price Act, prices in an area or under a state of

calamity or under an emergency shall be automatically frozen at their prevailing prices under automatic price control for 60 days unless sooner lifted.

Meralco to restore electricity once flooding subsides

The Manila Electric Company (Meralco) assured its customers on Wednesday that power restoration will be immediately done once floodwaters subside in areas affected by Typhoon Carina and the southwest monsoon (habagat).

"We are also closely monitoring the flooded areas. Our teams will immediately be deployed to restore power service once floods subside in the affected areas," Meralco vice president and head of corporate communications Joe Zaldarriaga said.

According to Meralco, as of 12 noon Wednesday, 124,679 customers in its franchise areas were affected by power outages amid the inclement weather.

A big chunk of the affected customers were in Metro Manila, with

96,605 customers reported to have no electricity; 11,422 customers in Cavite; 9,320 customers in Rizal; and 6,501 customers in Bulacan.

Some 459 Meralco customers in Batangas still had no electricity at noontime, while Laguna and Quezon have 326 and 46 affected customers, respectively.

"Rest assured that we are closely monitoring the situation and our crews are working non-stop to restore service as soon as possible. We urge everyone to prioritize safety and take necessary precautions during this time," Zaldarriaga said.

Meanwhile, the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines said its transmission lines and facilities are under normal operations as of 2 p.m. **(KC/PNA)**

secured a 50-megawatt power supply agreement with the Manila Electric Company (Meralco) for 20 years.

The Department of Energy (DOE) requires distribution utility companies like Meralco to source at least 2.52 percent of their energy requirement from RE sources.

Moreover, Lucci said the Maragondon solar power plant is poised to enhance economic growth and energy security in the region by creating local

employment opportunities and stimulating economic activities related to RE development and maintenance.

"Trust that we will continue to support the national government's agenda transition to clean energy sources, and we will proactively explore opportunities within the renewable space while capitalizing on innovative solutions to achieve energy security, dependability and affordability," he said. **(KC/PNA)**

Capital Region at 258,603 affected customers; followed by Bulacan with 41,783 customers; Rizal, 21,375 customers; and Cavite, 8,122 customers.

"Rest assured, our crews will immediately be

deployed to restore power in the affected areas once the floodwaters recede and everyone's safety is assured," the Meralco executive said.

Meanwhile, Meralco's corporate social

DENR pushes for development of renewable energy sector

The CALABARZON region is increasingly recognized for its potential as a hub for renewable energy development, thanks to existing initiatives and investments in clean energy.

During the Kapihan sa Bagong Pilipinas episode on July 16, Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) IV-A Regional Executive Director Nilo B. Tamoria highlighted the region's commitment to carrying out plans related to renewable energy, in partnership with various provincial, city, and municipal environment and natural resources offices.

"DENR CALABARZON welcomes projects related to renewable energy sources. In fact, the regional office, through the PENROs and CENROs

and the protected area management office of Alabat, has given full support and assistance towards the realization of a wind farm that will be established in Alabat Island in Quezon and Tanay, Rizal, making CALABARZON a home for renewable energy," Tamoria said.

Most recently, the Tanay wind power project that broke ground on June 4, promises a stable electricity supply at competitive prices, reduces dependence on fossil fuels, and contributes to the government's renewable energy target of 50 percent by 2040.

The region also hosts the highest wind farm in the country and the first wind farm facing the Pacific Ocean with the Alabat Wind Power Project in Quezon.

Adding to their



efforts, Tamoria proudly presents the CALABARZON region as the pilot site for Project TRANSFORM, or Transdisciplinary Approach for Resilient and Sustainable Communities, a local government unit-led multi-stakeholder

partnership model that aims to engage local governments in Environment and Natural Resource (ENR) governance.

"The initiative underscores the President's instruction to strengthen the enforcement of

environment and natural resources-related laws, especially those functions devolved to local government units in coordination and cooperation with concerned government agencies and private stakeholders. CALABARZON is

fortunate to have been chosen as a pilot site for the implementation of Project TRANSFORM, alongside Surigao del Norte and Bataan," he said.

Tamoria added that the department's initiatives and support for these projects demonstrate the region's leadership in advancing renewable energy solutions, supporting the Philippines' overall renewable energy targets and environmental goals that align with the Marcos Jr. administration's 8-point agenda for affordable and clean energy.

"As the President said, renewable energy is the way forward. Seeing the many benefits and opportunities of renewable energy projects in the region, we can expect more companies to be interested in this venture in the coming years," Tamoria stated. (AM, JM/PIA-4A)

No sanction against absent employees due to weather disturbances: DOLE

The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) Calabarzon has reminded employees that absences due to weather disturbances such as Typhoon Carina cannot be meted with administrative sanction from employers.

Dale Villafuerte, DOLE Calabarzon assistant labor inspection sector officer, clarified that Labor Advisory No. 17

Series of 2022 on the suspension of work in the private sector due to weather disturbances and similar occurrences is still enforceable.

"The advisory is still in effect since there is no other current advisory amending or repelling the same," he said in a phone interview Wednesday.

Villafuerte said that under the advisory, it is still the prerogative of

management, in coordination with their respective safety officers, to suspend work to ensure the safety and health of their employees during weather disturbances.

However, employees who fail or refuse to work by reason of eminent danger resulting from weather disturbances (such as the effects of Typhoon Carina) shall not be subject to any administrative sanction,

he quoted the section of the advisory.

Pending other company policies, it is mandated that if unworked, the employee is not entitled to a pay; if worked provided not less than six hours, an employee is entitled to the day's wage, he said.

According to the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), the region has an industry-driven economy, hosting



big companies in the electronics and semiconductor industries. It also has a vast human resource base for the manufacturing and services industries. (ZT/PNA)

Continues disaster management training conducted by CALABARZON DRRM

The Office of Civil Defense (OCD) – Region 4A continues to hold training sessions with local disaster risk reduction and management offices to enhance their preparedness and response capabilities.

These trainings aim to equip local officials and

personnel with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively manage and mitigate the impacts of disasters, ensuring the safety and resilience of their communities.

The OCD-Region 4A Director and RDRRMC CALABARZON Chairperson, Carlos

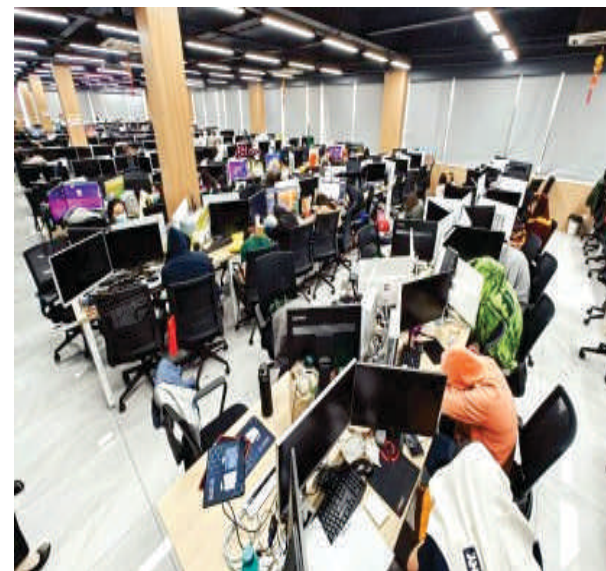
Eduardo Alvarez III, added that even local chief executives are mandated to attend these training sessions to ensure that they are knowledgeable about disaster risk management, enabling them to lead their communities effectively during emergencies and to implement disaster

preparedness measures efficiently.

“So in times of disaster, we all have to be synchronized. There should not be different styles of disaster response per LGU; that’s why we push for an operation center that we call a facility, which will serve as the coordination and information hub,” said Alvarez.

“We don’t wait for the disaster. We prepare before the disaster comes up. We are always on top of things and, at the same time, are prepared for disasters so that we can mitigate and respond to operations and circumstances requiring rehabilitation and recovery. So not only before the disaster, during the disaster, but even after the disaster, we are very focused on that,” he said.

During a meeting with the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, Alvarez concurred that the region implement the High Risk or Charlie protocol in Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) so that the region will be better equipped to respond to hazards and worst-case possible scenarios throughout the La Niña season. Senate panel to continue POGO hearings

MANILA – The Senate Committee on Women, Children, Family Relations and Gender Equality chaired by Senate Deputy Minority Leader Risa Hontiveros is set to continue its investigation on Philippine Offshore and Gaming Operations (POGOs) even after President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. declared a total POGO ban in the country during his recent State of the Nation Address.

“Kahit inanunsyo na ang pag-ban ng POGO, oversight function ng Senado ang matiyak na ang phaseout ay tunay na maipapatupad, na ang mga sangkot sa krimen ay matukoy, ang mga victim-survivors ay mabigyan ng hustisya, at na ang mga manggagawa ay mabigyan ng just transition (Even it was announced that POGO is banned, Senate’s oversight function should ensure that the phaseout will be truly implemented, that the perpetrators will be identified, justice will be served for victim-survivors, and workers will be given just transition),” Hontiveros said in a statement on Friday.

Failures in regulation should also be addressed, including government offices that were reportedly corrupted by POGOs, she said.

She said these problems should be addressed by new policies that can be pushed in the Senate.

During the previous hearings, the panel focused on the alleged involvement of suspended Bamban, Tarlac Mayor Alice Guo in the establishment of a POGO raided in her town, while also questioning her background and identity.

Guo was cited in contempt by the panel along with her parents Jian Zhong Guo and Wenyi Lin; her siblings Seimen Leal Guo, Shiela Guo, and Wesley Leal Guo; POGO incorporator Nancy Gamo, and former Technology and Livelihood Resource Center deputy director general Dennis Cunanan, for not attending the hearings.

“It’s not over yet. Hindi lang naman si Mayor Guo ang iniimbestigahan dito, kundi ang buong industriya ng POGO na nagdala ng samu’t saring krimen sa bansa (Guo is not the only one being investigated here, but the whole POGO industry which brought various crimes in the country),” Hontiveros said.

Hontiveros’ panel is set to resume the hearings on July 29. (PNA)

Lipa City, DOST team up for smart governance

DENR's 'whole-of-society' project launched to boost climate action

Protecting the environment and enhancing community resilience to the impacts of climate change require a collective effort from various government agencies and stakeholders, most importantly the private sector.

During the Kapihan sa Bagong Pilipinas episode, Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) IV-A Regional Executive Director Nilo B. Tamoria highlighted the significance and progress of its newly launched initiative, Project TRANSFORM, which seeks to employ a whole-of-society approach to increase capacities for environment and natural resource management, climate and disaster resilience, and socio-economic development.

“Project

TRANSFORM is a strategy for mobilizing other sectors in environmental projects. Typically, the mindset for protecting nature, utilizing resources, and safeguarding the environment is that it is not solely the government's job. It requires a whole-of-

society approach. Now, various sectors can contribute to realizing that mandate,” Tamoria stated.

The project stands for Transdisciplinary Approach for Resilience and Environmental Sustainability through Multi-stakeholder Engagement, with Rizal as the pilot province to test

the environment, infrastructure, local economy, and sustainable development.

The project also addresses existing issues and challenges within the area, which the DENR has previously handled solely. It contributes to enhancing DENR Field Office organizations by

institutionalizing project implementation mechanisms to guide and facilitate the project.

“This is the concept of Project TRANSFORM. We ensure that the project is participatory and that its success, especially in terms of the environment, depends on having many people working together.”

The project aims to address poverty, enhance community resilience, and foster public-private partnerships across the country's provinces, municipalities, and cities through environment protection initiatives. In Rizal province, the project specifically aims to increase the forest cover of the Upper Marikina River Basin Protected Landscape, reduce its vulnerability to erosion and landslides, and increase the water supply in the lowland communities.

Aside from Rizal, the project has been rolled out in Limay, Mariveles, and Orion in Bataan province; Ormoc City in Leyte; Malimono, San Francisco, and Burgos in Surigao del Norte province. The DENR continuously aims to replicate the project nationwide, particularly in the Calabarzon region, to yield good results.

“Here in Calabarzon, the Secretary has announced that the next target site will be the coastal area of Batangas. So that will be next, and once it is institutionalized and produces good results, it can be replicated in various locations here in CALABARZON and nationwide.”

Tamoria affirms the continued meetings, training sessions, and consultations with other stakeholders to develop a comprehensive plan for developing a responsive and sustainable environmental plan. (CO/PIA-4A)



SSS reiterates: 'Social security is a basic human right'

The Social Security System (SSS) holds the simultaneous National Registration Day on July 15, as it aims to reiterate to its members, beneficiaries of SSS members, and non-members that being a member of the State insurance program is beneficial for their future.

During the program held at the University of the Philippines-Los Baños (UPLB), SSS Luzon Operations Group Senior Vice President Atty. Antonio Argabioso urges employees and self-earning individuals not to deprive themselves of

their right to access various services and benefits available to them.

“Claim our right. Social security is a basic human right. Let's not neglect our rights. Our motto at SSS is “No One should leave behind”. So everyone is included. We will not allow those to be left without social security benefits. This is our right,” he said.

Adding to their efforts to make everyone aware of the significance of social security as a fundamental human right, SSS has registered nearly 2,000 job order (JO) employees, Contract of Service (COS)

workers, as well as some students of UPLB.

Vice President Edwin Igharas of the SSS South Luzon I Division highlighted the importance of government employees becoming members of the SSS as it provides them with access to social security benefits, which can shoulder financial woes in times of need such as sickness, maternity, disability, retirement, and death.

“The number one importance of why we did this is for the JOs to have social security benefits and begin their contribution. Although the others are

already aware of being SSS members, they are unable to contribute. One hindrance is because when this is the case, no one supervises their contribution. They pay individually per month, while others can only pay quarterly. Whereas if we have an agreement with officials, they can be the one will pay the contribution for all their employees. Better yet, they are guaranteed to be paid and have SSS,” Igharas said.

He added: “We can also educate them on the importance of SSS through our seminar as we

discussed recent updates to the SSS, such as improvements in online services and new policies aimed at enhancing member experience.”

Jan Danica Asma, a newly-hired employee of UPLB who came from a private company, had the opportunity to update her SSS membership during the National Registration Day and allow her to ensure her membership records were up to date, reflecting her new employment status, and securing her continued access to the benefits provided by the SSS.

“Thankfully, I don't need to go to [an] SSS office physically because of this program. I already updated my dependents and other info here in university and hopefully, I will be able to contribute again in individual voluntary payment.”

SSS affirms its continued improvement of systems and processes to provide more convenient and reliable social security protection, especially by spearheading on-ground activities that makes social security more accessible to more Filipinos. (AM/PIA-4A)

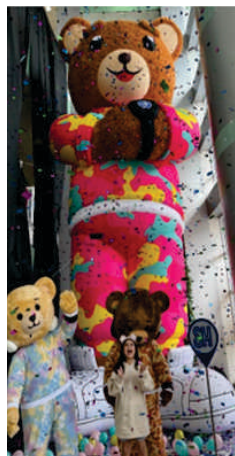
